



GREENWOOD TRANSIT AND SIDEWALK PROJECT – N 90TH ST TO N 105TH ST

Fall 2015

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

SDOT will improve bus stops and sidewalks on Greenwood Avenue N between N 90th Street and N 105th Street. Our goal is to make it safer and easier for people to travel and make bus service more efficient and reliable through the corridor.

BENEFITS

- Improved safety for people who walk, drive, and bike in the area
- More visually appealing corridor
- Improved sidewalk access and crosswalks at intersections
- Improved safety and comfort for transit riders
- More predictable travel patterns for all road users

IMPROVEMENTS

- 6-foot wide concrete sidewalk with curbs on the east side of Greenwood Avenue N from N 92nd Street to N 105th Street
- 5-foot wide planting strip between the sidewalk and the road along most of the east side of Greenwood Avenue N
- Curb ramps compliant with American With Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- Bus stop closures and relocations to improve bus stop spacing
- New in-lane bus islands, shelters and lighting at the intersections of N 92nd Street and N 97th Street

SCHEDULE

- Design: Complete
- Construction: September 2015 to April 2016

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

People biking will ride between the planting strip and the new bus islands. Please remember to watch for and yield to pedestrians.

Bus riders will cross the bike lane to get to and from the bus island. Signs will alert bicyclists to yield to pedestrians as they approach the crosswalk to the bus island.

People driving will use the same travel lane as buses. Please stop behind buses as passengers get on and off.
