

CENTRAL AREA NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY TEMPORARY LANE AND STREET CLOSURES

Beginning December 4

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will construct new curb ramps and new sidewalk at the intersections of Boyer Ave E and E Howe St and Boyer Ave E and 23rd Ave E beginning on Friday, December 4. This work is part of Phase 3 installation of the Central Area Neighborhood Greenway Project.

Weather permitting, work at these intersections will be complete by Wednesday, December 16.

Intermittent Lane and Street Closures


During this work, Boyer Ave E will be reduced to one lane. Flaggers will be on site from 7 AM to 4 PM, Monday through Friday, to direct traffic.

Crews will begin by closing the intersection of Boyer Ave E and E Howe Street. Vehicles will not be permitted to turn north onto E Howe St from Boyer Ave E. Local traffic to E Howe St will be permitted via E Blaine St. During the week of December 7, crews are scheduled to open the E Howe St intersection and move their work to the Boyer Ave E and 23rd Ave E intersection. This intersection is expected to be closed until the week of December 14. Local traffic to 23rd Ave E will be permitted via E Newton St.

These lane reductions and street closures will only be in force during periods of active work by the contractor.

Project Information

Earlier this year, SDOT installed Phase 1 of the Central Area Neighborhood Greenway on residential streets parallel to 23rd Ave between S Jackson St and E John St. Phase 3 of the greenway runs between E John St and E Roanoke St, primarily on 21st Ave E and 22nd Ave E.



Phase 3 will be complete by spring 2016. Be Super Safe!

When near a work zone, please follow these safety guidelines:

- Reduce speeds
- Use caution
- Keep a safe distance from construction equipment and workers

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Normal work hours will be from 7 AM to 4 PM
- Temporary on-street parking restrictions
- Temporary access restrictions on residential streets
- Pedestrian and bicycle detours
- Light construction noise
- Access to businesses and residences will be maintained except when temporary restrictions are necessary
