



## 23rd Avenue Corridor Improvements Project

### Water main work between E Union St and E John St to conclude in February

Crews will be working north of E Union St to replace the water main under 23rd Ave. Please see below for details.

#### Traffic impacts

- Northbound and southbound traffic will be maintained, though travel will be reduced to one lane in each direction
- Traffic between E Union St and E John St will be shifted to the west side of 23rd Ave (see map to the right)
- This traffic shift is expected to be in place through the end of February 2016, though some of the work is weather dependent and subject to change

#### Driveway and side street impacts

- Neighbors adjacent to the work area can expect short-term driveway impacts between 7 AM and 5 PM on weekdays
- Periodic side-street closures (lasting 2 to 10 days) will be required

#### Occasional water service interruptions

- Seattle Public Utilities will provide advance notice to any businesses or residents who will experience temporary water shut-offs while crews work on the new water main

#### Transit, bicycle, and pedestrian info

- King County Metro route 48 service will continue during this work, though temporary bus stop relocations can be expected. Check for posted Rider Alerts, call Metro at 206-553-3000, or visit [metro.kingcounty.gov/alerts/](http://metro.kingcounty.gov/alerts/)
- Pedestrian and bicycle access will be maintained
- Flaggers will be present at times to assist pedestrians and help manage traffic

#### Access to businesses and churches

- Access to businesses and churches will be maintained at all times
- Please continue to support area businesses during this work



### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Typical work hours from 7 AM to 5 PM on weekdays
- Possible night and weekend work
- Longer travel times due to traffic changes
- Short-term driveway impacts on 23rd Avenue
- Periodic side-street closures
- Occasional water service interruptions
- Temporary parking limitations on side streets
- Noise, dust, and vibration
- Heavy equipment and trucks in the area
