## 23rd Avenue Corridor Improvements Project

### Water main work and utility interruptions planned for E Yesler Way intersection July 17 - 19

Starting as early as 7 PM on Friday, July 17, through 8 AM on Sunday, July 19, access to the intersection of E Yesler Way and 23rd Avenue will be closed to traffic. This closure is necessary for crews to conduct water main work within the intersection.

#### Work hours and impacts

- **Crews will work continuously from 7 PM, Friday, July 17 to 8 AM, Sunday, July 19**
- You will experience noise, dust and vibration from excavation activities
- The contractor is in the process of obtaining a noise variance from the City for this work
- We apologize for the inconvenience and appreciate your patience

#### Utility interruptions

- Seattle Public Utilities is providing notice to businesses and residents who will experience temporary water shut-offs while crews work on the new water main
- Utility interruptions are expected to occur between 7AM to 7 PM, Saturday, July 18

#### Traffic impacts

- The intersection will be completely closed to traffic
- Detour routes will be clearly posted; please follow signed detours and avoid cutting through neighborhood streets
- Local access to residents and businesses will be provided
- The northbound 23rd Avenue detour to Martin Luther King Jr Way will remain in place

#### Transit, bicycle and pedestrian info


- Metro bus routes #27 and southbound #48 will be affected by this work; look for posted Rider Alerts and learn more by calling Metro at 206-553-3000
- Bicyclists should also detour around the intersection during this work
- Pedestrian crossings will be maintained
- Flaggers and uniformed police officers will be present to assist pedestrians and manage traffic

#### Upcoming July work dates

- Friday, July 24, through Monday, July 27, crews will be working at the S Jackson St intersection

#### Businesses are open

- We encourage you to continue supporting businesses in the area throughout construction
- You can continue to access businesses on foot, as pedestrian access will be maintained, or by car, by entering the local access areas
