



# ARBOR HEIGHTS ELEMENTARY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROJECT

## ABOUT THE PROJECT

This Safe Routes to School (SRTS) project will make it safer and easier for kids to walk and bike in your neighborhood. This project was originally nominated for consideration as a way of improving connections for people walking and biking along 35th Ave SW, from SW 100th to SW 106th, near Arbor Heights Elementary School. Funding for this project comes from the School Safety Traffic and Pedestrian Improvement Fund and the Levy to Move Seattle.

## TIMING AND BENEFITS

We expect construction will begin in mid-2017.

These improvements will improve neighborhood connectivity so it's safer and smoother for people walking, biking, and driving. Improvements include:

- New and widened sidewalks to improve walking connections to and from Arbor Heights Elementary School
- New parking strip on the west side of 35th Ave SW
- Crosswalks to increase visibility of pedestrians
- ADA-compliant curb ramps for better accessibility
