





# POSSIBLE TRAFFIC SAFETY IMPROVEMENT AT 17TH AVENUE NW AND NW 57TH STREET

As part of developing a north south neighborhood greenway connecting Salmon Bay to Soundview Playfield, the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is evaluating a safety improvement at 17th Avenue NW and NW 57th Street. A safety island/partial closure at the northeast corner will improve post office drop-off access and reduce cut-thru traffic. Seventeenth Avenue NW will continue to operate as a two-way street, however northbound traffic will be directed to turn left or right at NW 57th Street. See the reverse side for more information.
