



Roadway construction at 21st Ave SW and 22nd Ave SW begins October 12


On Monday, October 12, the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will begin installing a new storm drain system just north of where 22nd Ave SW merges with 21st Ave SW. This work is expected to take a few days to complete. Crews will return later in October to install curb ramps, sidewalk on the west side of 21st Ave SW, and a new crosswalk just south of the intersection. This work is part of the Delridge-Highland Park Neighborhood Greenway Project.

TRAFFIC CHANGES DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Temporary lane restrictions near the work area, where 21st Ave SW merges with 22nd Ave SW.
- Two-way traffic will be maintained.
- Flaggers directing traffic at either end of lane restrictions
- Bus routes will not be affected

PROJECT INFORMATION

Greenways are residential streets made safer and more comfortable for people of all ages and abilities to walk and ride bikes. This work is part of the Delridge-Highland Park Greenway Project that will connect White Center to the West Seattle Bridge Trail. The greenway will run north-south, generally along 17th Ave SW in the south and 21st Ave SW in the north. We anticipate that construction of the greenway will be complete by the end of the year.



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Temporary lane restrictions on 22nd Ave SW and 21st Ave SW
- Flaggers at either end of lane restrictions on 22nd Ave SW and 21st Ave SW to maintain two way traffic
- Weekday work hours from 7 AM to 7 PM
- Noise, dust, and vibration typical of construction

This work is weather dependent and may be rescheduled if needed.
