

# DELDRIDGE/HIGHLAND PARK GREENWAY

JUNE 2015



The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is building a network of neighborhood greenways. Neighborhood greenways are safer, calm residential streets for you, your family and neighbors.

## Neighborhood Greenways

Neighborhood greenways are not car-free zones; they do not add bike lanes and have minimal, if any, on-street parking impacts.

Greenways can:

- Help improve safety
- Help people cross busy streets
- Discourage cut-thru traffic
- Protect the residential character of neighborhoods
- Keep vehicle speeds low
- Get people to where they want to go (e.g., schools, parks, shops and restaurants)

## Project overview

The greenway will run north-south, connecting White Center to the West Seattle Bridge Trail. The greenway route will run generally along 17th Avenue SW in the south and 21st Avenue SW in the north.

## Schedule and funding

The project contractor will begin installing the project elements as soon as August 2015. Construction is expected to last approximately six months; however, the duration of work at a given site will likely be much shorter.


This project is being funded by the voter-approved Bridging the Gap transportation levy. This project is part of a \$3.8 million budget to design and construct the 2015 Delridge and Ballard Greenways.

## Elements of this greenway include:

- **Speed humps and all-way stops**, where needed, generally about one per block, to help keep speeds low and drivers from using neighborhood streets as alternatives to arterials
- **Pavement markings and signage** to alert motorists to expect people biking and walking
- **Way-finding signs** to let greenway users know where they are and how far their destination may be
- **Improved crossings** to make it easier for pedestrians and bike riders to cross intersections
- **Spot pavement repairs** to improve roadway user safety

SDOT is working with Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) to install natural drainage systems and neighborhood greenway improvements along 17th Avenue SW, between SW Henderson Street and SW Kenyon Street beginning late summer 2015.
