

## 2014 Fall Safe Routes to School Mini Grant Awards

School	School Type	Grades	District	Award	Project Description
Adams Elementary School	Public	K-5	Ballard	\$ 500	Adams Elementary PTA will use these funds to purchase supplies to create flag holders and purchase flags (and replacement flags) to be used at the crosswalks at 26th Ave NW & 65th Street, 28th Ave NW & NW 65th St, and 32nd Ave NW & NE 61st St. They will purchase PVC pipe and caps, zip ties, all-purpose cement and packing tape to create and label the flag buckets. They will also purchase high visibility flags and reflective tape.
Bryant Elementary School	Public	K-5	Northeast	\$ 1,000	Bryant PTSA will hold four events: Bike to School Month (May), Walk to School Month (October), and one bicycle meet-up in December. The funds will be used for small treats to attract students and their parents to walking and biking, prizes to reward kids for biking and walking, signs and flyers to advertise the events, as well as maps and safety information.
Coe Elementary School	Public	K-5	Magnolia/Queen Anne	\$ 1,000	Coe Elementary School will use these funds to further develop their student safety patrol team by purchasing more supplies (including vests, flags, hats/helmets, cones and signage). Student safety patrol members will receive special recognition and incentives to reward them for their duties and encourage continued modeling of the school's behavioral expectations.
Denny Middle School	Public	6-8	Delridge	\$ 1,000	Denny Middle School PTSA will post walking and bicycling safety tips around the school halls year round and create a recognition process to encourage more students to ride and walk such as small treat days and safety prizes. Denny M.S. PTSA will purchase bike supplies, fix up bikes, and give them away to kids who do not have access to bikes. Denny M.S. PTSA will host the third annual bike ride from Denny to Lincoln Park.
Dunlap Elementary School	Public	K-5	Southeast	\$ 1,000	Boys and Girls Clubs of King County will purchase vests and cover printing and training costs for the Safe Passage program. Boys and Girls Clubs of King County will also purchase incentives for the volunteers participating in the Safe Passage program, such as swim passes to Rainier Beach Pool and Metro and Sound Transit passes.
Eckstein Middle School	Public	6-8	Northeast	\$ 1,000	Eckstein Bikes! (Eckstein M.S. PTSA) will host treat and/or prize days at least once each in the fall and winter, and likely 2-3 times in the spring. Eckstein Bikes! will host Bike to School events, which may include workshops, education events, bike rodeos, and/or after school bike-to-school celebrations. Eckstein Bikes! will provide promotional materials, signage, and flyers to inform students and the broader community of the program, as well as maps and safety tips to the students. This may also include safety-related signage and/or crossing flags near the school or on school district property.
Graham Hill Elementary School	Public	K-5	Southeast	\$ 1,000	Graham Hill Elementary will use funds to purchase flags and buckets for multiple crossing areas near the school. The funds will also be used for safety vests and backpack(s) for walking school bus group(s). Remaining funds will be used to produce and make available, a safe routes to school map for families with walking/biking students.

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Jane Addams Middle School	Public	6-8	North	\$ 1,000	Jane Addams Middle School PTSA (JAMS PTSA) will purchase sandwich board signs to place around the school to guide parent/student drop-off/pick-up and minimize safety risk to walkers and cyclists and students exiting cars. JAMS PTSA will purchase pedestrian crossing flags to supplement existing flag buckets at crossings near the school. JAMS will purchase traffic safety cones to help improve traffic flow near the school during drop-off and pick-up times.
John Stanford Elementary School	Public	K-5	Lake Union	\$ 1,000	John Stanford International School will purchase large street cones, large tripod signs, whistles, safety patrol flags, helmets and vests to make students more visible and prevent illegal parking.
Kimball Elementary School	Public	K-5	Greater Duwamish	\$ 943	Kimball Elementary PTSA will use grant funds to purchase pedestrian flags and mounting devices at four legal crossings near the school and to purchase walking and bicycling incentives such as stickers, buttons, and magnets.
Laurelhurst Elementary School	Public	K-5	Northeast	\$ 1,000	The Laurelhurst Elementary PTA will host Walktober in October and Bike to School Month in May, including prizes, refreshments, and snacks, an Urban Cycling class, and a biking field trip to Magnuson Park.
Rainier Beach High School	Public	7-12	Southeast	\$ 1,000	Rainier Beach High School will purchase two-way radios with headsets. The two-way radios will be the primary source of communication for the Safe Passage Team. All Safe Passage Team Members will be required to have a two-way radio during their shift at assigned corridors on Rainier Beach Campus.
Roosevelt High School	Public	7-12	Northeast	\$ 600	Roosevelt High School PTSA will host a series of treat and/or prize days in the spring, culminating with an end of May Bike to School Month celebration. The program will provide promotional materials, signage, fliers, maps, safety tips, and safety-related signage.
Sand Point Elementary School	Public	K-5	Northeast	\$ 1,000	Sand Point Elementary PTA will host a Bike to School Day/Month, bike safety assembly, after-school weekly cycle club, bike rodeo, and walking school bus.
South Shore K-8 School	Public	K-8	Southeast	\$ 1,000	South Shore K-8 will purchase raincoats, umbrellas, flashlights, whistles, and lighted wands for adults, including trained parent and community volunteers who will position themselves as "touchstones" for children along the busier traffic arterials, including Henderson and Rainier. South Shore K-8 will purchase buckets and flags for two intersections for safer crossings. Personalized signs will be posted to mark the Passageway and Touchstone spots along Henderson.
St Alphonsus Parish School	Private	K-8	Ballard	\$ 1,000	St Alphonsus Parish School will use these funds to purchase signage/ safety elements to discourage drivers from parking their cars on the paved planting strip along NW 59th St adjacent to the school and to promote safe biking and walking to school on Bike to School Day in May.
Thornton Creek Elementary School	Public	K-5	Northeast	\$ 1,000	Thornton Creek Elementary PTA will host bike train events, distribute front and rear bicycle lights to students, subsidize bicycle helmets for students and host a helmet fitting.
Thurgood Marshall Elementary School	Public	K-5	Central	\$ 1,000	Thurgood Marshall Elementary PTA will purchase pedestrian crossing flags and holders to replenish and expand the number of flagged crosswalks in the school walk zone.
Whittier Elementary School	Public	K-5	Ballard	\$ 1,000	Two areas adjacent to existing asphalt will be prepared to provide a surface for bike racks on the Whittier Elementary School playground. Educational signs and materials will also be created and distributed to improve traffic flow and safety at Whittier Elementary School.
