GREEN PRESERVATION and Transit Stations

Explore how green building and historic preservation can work together in a transit station redevelopment project in your community. This webinar will focus on a series of case studies that highlight the challenges and successes of transit stations that feature green preservation. Blending together green building and preservation goals in a single building can yield improved overall project outcomes. The adaptive re-use of an existing building, which retains a significant amount of embodied energy, and the green building elements play a role in local sustainable development efforts. Successful projects create more livable communities while generating increased environmental, cultural, and transportation benefits.

The webinar will feature an overview of Green Preservation (green building + historic preservation) with issues ranging from historic tax credits to green building certification. Three case studies will illustrate a blend of green building and historic preservation transit station projects in St. Paul, Minnesota; Columbia, Missouri; and Seattle, Washington. Representatives from each project team will discuss lessons learned, replicable methods of funding, and the project's impact on the surrounding community.

FTA, DOT, and EPA representatives will highlight the federal and state funding options, including US DOT TIGER grants, available to implement green preservation and transit station projects in your community.
