Construction Notice

The following construction activities are anticipated in August:

-  Road closure
-  Lane closure
-  Night Work

Beginning week of August 8: Rebuilding and paving 9th Ave. N between Aloha St. and Broad St., beginning with the west side of the street.


What to expect:

- Day work rebuilding, grading and paving
- Night work, tentatively scheduled for the week of August 15, including night closures of 9th Ave. N between Aloha St. and Broad St. beginning as early as 7:00 p.m. with street reopening by 5:00 a.m.
- Day work installing foundation and conduits for street lights. Pedestrians can expect portions of the sidewalk to be intermittently closed. Pedestrian and vehicle access to businesses will be maintained.

Beginning week of August 15: All lanes of Westlake Ave. N between Aloha St. and 8th Ave. N will be shifted to the west side of the roadway to accommodate underground electrical installations. Daytime work for approximately five weeks.

Beginning week of August 8: Intermittent night closures of up to three lanes of Mercer St. and intermittent local access only to Terry Ave. N and Boren Ave. N for approximately three weeks.

Week of August 15: Night closures of up to three lanes of Mercer St. at 9th Ave. N for underground electrical installations. Night work hours are 7:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. Please note that crews will also work up to 24 hours per day during the weekend of August 13/14 while Mercer St. is restricted to one lane due to the I-5 ramp closure.
