ABOUT THE PROJECT

This Safe Routes to School (SRTS) project will make it safer and easier for kids to walk and bike in your neighborhood. The project was originally nominated for consideration by Montlake community members through our Neighborhood Street Fund program as a way of improving connections for people walking and biking at the E Lynn St and 19th Ave E intersection. Funding for this project comes from the School Safety Traffic and Pedestrian Improvement Fund and the Levy to Move Seattle.

TIMING AND BENEFITS

We expect construction will begin in mid-2017. These improvements will shorten crossing distances and organize the intersection so it's safer and smoother for people walking, biking, and driving. Improvements include:

- Sidewalk restoration to improve walking connections between Montlake Elementary School and the Montlake Community Center and Playfield
- An all-way stop to improve the flow of traffic through the intersection
- A curb bulb to shorten the crossing distance for people walking
- ADA-compliant curb ramps for better accessibility
- A raised crosswalk to increase visibility of pedestrians
