

NOTICE OF UPCOMING WORK

April 3, 2015

Water service line upgrades to occur in your neighborhood in April

Work being performed in conjunction with 23rd Avenue Corridor Improvements Project

PROJECT / DESCRIPTION

Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) will work in your neighborhood during **April 6 - 30, 2015**. This work is a part of the Seattle Department of Transportation's (SDOT's) **23rd Avenue Corridor Improvements Project**.

To prepare for the larger water main replacement work that will occur in your neighborhood later this year, SPU crews will replace older water service lines along 23rd Avenue in April. Customers, who already have newer water service lines, do not need them upgraded at this time.

In order to perform this preliminary work, some customers will have their water temporarily shut off for about 30 minutes, but no longer than two hours on one day in April. SPU will notify affected customers by knocking on their door before the water is shut off.

SCHEDULE

SPU will begin working on Monday, April 6, and expects to have the water services replacement work completed by April 30. Crews will work intermittently on 23rd Avenue from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on weekdays and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekends.

LOCATION

Work will occur along 23rd Avenue from South Jackson Street to East Cherry Street.

PROJECT IMPACTS

- **Water shutdown:** Some customers will be without water service for up to two hours.
- **Lane closures and detours:** Lanes along 23rd Avenue from S. Jackson to E. Cherry will be reduced from four to two while crews are working.
- **Noise:** There will be increased noise from trucks and equipment used to dig concrete.
- **Restricted parking:** Some street parking around the work zone will be restricted.
- **Temporary discolored water:** When the water is turned back on, some customers may need to run their faucets for a few minutes to remove any discoloration in the water.
