




# U DISTRICT NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

Last November, SDOT hosted a public meeting and gathered input on building a neighborhood greenway in the U District neighborhood. The input we received at the open house and through emails has had a positive influence on the project. Based on feedback, agency coordination and our evaluation we recommend a greenway on 12th Avenue NE with the improvements shown on the map. Not shown on the map, but also included are wayfinding signs, reducing the speed limit from 25MPH to 20MPH and pavement and sidewalk repairs. **Please attend our open house. We're interested in your feedback.**

Seattle is building a network of neighborhood greenways. Neighborhood greenways are safer, calmer residential streets for you, your family and neighbors. On streets with low car volumes and speeds a greenway can:

- Improve safety
- Help people cross busy streets
- Discourage cut-thru traffic
- Protect the residential character of our neighborhoods
- Keep speeds low
- Get people to where they want to go like parks, schools, shops and restaurants
