Proposed Revisions to Rainier Avenue

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is proposing to make changes to Rainier Avenue to create a safer parking lane, improve transit reliability, and increase safety for pedestrians. We are soliciting your comments on the following proposed permanent revisions:

- In some areas, on-street parking will be removed from one side of the street and an 8-foot wide parking lane will be striped on the other side of the street
- Sidewalks will be widened at some bus stops to improve passenger waiting areas and prevent buses from needing to merge into and out of traffic
- The “inside” travel lanes will be widened from 9 to 11 feet
- Curb ramps will be installed to improve access for strollers, carts, persons with disabilities, and others



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
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What will Rainier Avenue look like with these improvements?
