

# Transit/Pedestrian Improvements to Aurora Avenue


The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is proposing improvements to several bus stops along Aurora to make it more comfortable to wait for transit and provide more room to pedestrians.

In response to very narrow sidewalks and heavy transit use, SDOT proposes to reconfigure access to/from several residential side streets that are adjacent to busy Aurora bus stops. These changes would include the following:


- Transit “mini-plazas” with expanded waiting areas, new landscaping, pedestrian lighting, and other improvements in anticipation of King County Metro’s future Rapid Ride bus service
- A better walking environment along Aurora Ave (new curb ramps, sidewalk repairs, and bus shelters located out of the way of pedestrians)
- The potential for traffic-calming benefits on residential side-streets and improved traffic safety along Aurora Ave



# Metro Route 358

## Proposed Bus Stop Improvement


Direction of Improvements:
