

FREMONT CIRCULATION IMPROVEMENTS

There's more than one project coming to Fremont! Beginning Summer 2005, SDOT will break ground on several nearby intersection and circulation improvements. These improvements will permanently enhance safety and mobility for motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists while easing temporary traffic impacts during construction on the Fremont Bridge.

To help manage traffic, SDOT will:

- ✳ Install six new traffic signals.
- ✳ Upgrade nine existing signals.
- ✳ Install traffic calming devices at three intersections.
- ✳ Reconfigure N 36th Street at Evanston Avenue N.
- ✳ Install a variable message sign to inform drivers when the bridge is closed to traffic.
- ✳ Install traffic cameras to monitor traffic near the bridge.



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SDOT is planning to complete more than a dozen improvements along Bridge Way east of Fremont Avenue including new signals at the Aurora on- and off-ramps. Construction is scheduled to begin Summer 2005.

The combined improvements resulting from the Fremont Bridge Approach Replacement Project and the Fremont Circulation Improvements Project will make Fremont a safer place for pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists to live, work and play.



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
