



Construction Impacts

Project Elements:

- Between N 128th and N 145th streets, pedestrian safety will be enhanced with continuous sidewalks, added curbs and curb-ramps, a pedestrian crossing at the Community Center, and improved street lighting and drainage.
- The project will control and define on-street parking and access, enhance bicycle safety through cycle tracks separated from pedestrians, calm traffic speeds through street development, and clean up and beautify the entire corridor Linden Avenue North Corridor.
- The corridor will be re-paved and the roadway will be widened; street trees and landscape planting will be added along both sides of the street and the missing Interurban Trail link will be completed.



What to Expect During Construction:

- Traffic Restrictions
 - Lane closures
 - During significant construction activities, such as grinding and paving, portions of the road will be closed and traffic will be detoured.
- Parking and loading restrictions
 - On-street parking will be impacted and sections will be temporarily removed while construction is ongoing; advance notice will be provided.
- Pedestrian and bike detours
 - Appropriate signage will be used to guide bicyclists around the work zone for the duration of the project.
- Short-term driveway restrictions
- Construction noise and dust
- Occasional night work and street closures
- Some tree trimming and or removal. Street trees will be replaced on this project in excess of the standard 2 to 1 ratio called for in City of Seattle Urban Forestry Guidelines.

from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.




Construction Sequencing

Construction Phases & Work Zones

The project corridor has been divided into four work zones. The Contractor will begin construction in Zone 2. Work will likely take place in multiple segments simultaneously, with the exception of Zones 2 & 3. Additional information about the construction schedule will be available on the project website in the coming weeks. Construction is anticipated to be complete by Spring 2013.


Additionally, as information regarding detour routes becomes available, construction notices will be provided and updates will be made to the project website.
