

Final traffic configuration of Roy St. features new bike lanes

The final traffic configuration includes the following features:

- One lane of traffic in each direction
- New bike lanes will be installed on each side of the roadway
- New turn lanes at designated intersections
- Parking remains on the north side of the street between 1st Ave. N and 5th Ave. N

Roy St. transitions to two-way traffic this Spring

The transition to two-way traffic on Roy St. between Queen Anne Ave. N and 5th Ave. N will take approximately two weeks to complete.

Beginning as early as the week of May 12, you can expect to see the following changes:

- Westbound Roy St. will be reduced to one lane while final channelization is put into place.
- Parking temporarily restricted while channelization is put into place.


Beginning as early as the week of May 19, you can expect to see the following changes:

- Signals will be activated for two-way traffic on Roy St. starting at 5th Ave. N and working toward Queen Anne Ave. N.
- Two-way traffic on Roy St. between Queen Anne Ave. N and 5th Ave. N is anticipated to open following signal activation, weather permitting.
