Delridge Way SW Paving Project SW Orchard Street to SW Henderson Street

August 28, 2012

The Seattle Department of Transportation will rebuild much of Delridge Way SW next year to improve travel conditions and promote safety. The project will not only include new concrete and asphalt paving and new upgraded curb ramps, but also new drainage detention pipes to slow the rate of storm water flow into Longfellow Creek during periods of heavy rain.

The construction contract covers SW Delridge Way from SW Henderson to SW Orchard streets and may also include SW Delridge Way and 16th Ave SW, both between Henderson and Roxbury, if funds can be stretched that far. The project work will be divided into four phases, with more added if funds cover the additional proposed segments.

During construction northbound traffic will remain on Delridge Way SW, except for a few weekends when crews are transitioning between phases. Southbound traffic, including Metro routes, will be detoured to the west during active construction on each project phase. Work will start at Henderson, and proceed two to three blocks at a time, to minimize the inconvenience of the southbound detour route.

This paving project is funded by the Bridging the Gap transportation levy approved by Seattle voters in 2006.

Project Scope & Schedule:

The design for this project is complete and in September the project and its possible additional segments will be advertised for contractors to bid on the work. Bids should be received in October, with final scope of the project determined by those bids in relation to construction costs. Work is expected to be awarded to the lowest qualified bidder in December of 2012.

Minor elements of work (land survey, utility line relocations, etc.) could begin this fall, but the main construction will take place between January and December of 2013.
