





RPZ Public Hearing Process



Restricted Parking Zone details

What is an RPZ?

- Curbspace = public
- Permit exempts vehicle from certain time limit




Why have RPZs?

- Support residential access
- Balance competing needs


How do permits work?

- 1 decal/vehicle (registered at your address; \$45 for 2-yr period)
- 4 permits/household
- 1 guest pass/address (\$15)
- Not exempt from 72-hr rule




Zone 4

- Established in 1983
- 7am to 6pm, Mon – Sat
- Proposal to fill existing gaps and improve residential access
- Three blocks along E John St (not in draft proposal, added to final plan)



Zone 21

- Established in 2003
- Restrictions vary between paid and unpaid areas
- Proposal to increase residential parking availability in dense area where there currently is no RPZ
- Encourages turnover in mixed use area just north of E Pine St by installing paid parking
- All residential blocks south of E Olive Way and west of Broadway (not in draft proposal, added to final plan)
