In the process of developing this plan, SDOT has collected data on parking utilization and turnover and has worked with community members at several community meetings to identify the proposed parking changes outlined on the opposite side of this mailer.



PROPOSED PARKING MANAGEMENT PLAN



WHAT'S THE PLAN?

- Install or replace 2-hour time limit signs on both sides of:
 - 38th Ave SW between SW Oregon St and SW Alaska St
 - 37th Ave SW between SW Oregon St and SW Alaska St
 - SW Snoqualmie St between 37th Ave SW and 35th Ave SW
- Install or replace 4-hour time limit signs on both sides of:
 - 39th Ave SW between SW Oregon St and Fauntleroy Way SW
 - 36th Ave SW between SW Oregon St and SW Alaska St
- Allow parking on both sides of:
 - 37th Ave SW between SW Alaska St and SW Edmunds St
 - SW Edmunds St between 37th Ave SW and 36th Ave SW

As a part of this plan, existing loading zones will be preserved and corner clearance signs will be installed to improve pedestrian visibility.
