 LENGTH 2 miles to Ledge  
 11 miles to Snoqualmie Point Park  
 DIFFICULTY Moderate to Difficult  
 USERS Foot only
- 3** TRAIL IRON HORSE STATE PARK  
 LENGTH 18 miles to Snoqualmie Pass Tunnel  
 DIFFICULTY Easy to Moderate  
 USERS Foot, Bike, Horse
- 4** TRAIL SNOQUALMIE VALLEY  
 LENGTH 8 miles to North Bend  
 DIFFICULTY Easy  
 USERS Foot, Bike, Horse
