



Genesee Area Combined Sewer Overflow Reduction Neighborhood Meeting

Seattle Public Utilities is working on a city-wide effort to improve the health of our waterways by reducing combined sewer overflows. During heavy rains, the combination of stormwater (about 90 percent of the volume) and sewage may exceed the capacity of the system and overflow into our waterways – causing a combined sewer overflow (CSO). Reducing combined sewer overflows will protect Lake Washington and make sure Seattle complies with federal and state water quality regulations.

At Genesee's CSO Reduction public meeting on September 21st, 2010, a few households expressed interest in exploring and understanding the 54th Avenue South underground pipe storage alternative. As a result, Seattle Public Utilities would like to have a discussion with neighbors along 54th Avenue South between South Alaska Street and South Angeline Street about this alternative and obtain additional feedback.
