Join the Seattle Pedestrian Advisory Board!

The Seattle Pedestrian Advisory Board (SPAB) is now accepting letters of interest to fill several member positions. The <u>SPAB</u>, which was created by Seattle City Council in 1993, plays an influential role in making walking and using a wheelchair or other mobility device safer and easier by implementing Seattle's Pedestrian Master Plan. The board advises the Mayor and City Council, participates in planning and project development, evaluates policies, and makes recommendations to all city departments including the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT).

The SPAB members tend to travel by foot, wheelchair, or with the assistance of a mobility device regularly, represent a variety of ages, levels of mobility, and our City's diverse communities. Members must be Seattle residents. The board meets the second Wednesday of each month from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. downtown at City Hall on Fifth Avenue between James and Cherry streets. All members are unpaid volunteers, however some travel costs are covered.

The City of Seattle is committed to promoting diversity in the City's boards and commissions.
