I believe that my career solving land use issues in the public and private sectors best meets the expectations for the city council seat to be vacated by Councilmember Rob Johnson. For the past twenty years, I have resided in District #4, guided the Department of Construction and Inspections as a senior land use planner/supervisor (1999-2019) and volunteered on the Children's Hospital Master Plan Standing Committee.

My familiarity with the district includes facilitating public meetings and design review meetings for over 30 development projects in the area. As the project planner, I listened to and assessed public comment, responded to technical and procedural questions, and ensured that constructive dialogue occurred both during meetings and throughout the entitlement process. Both residents and developers credited my fairness and technical knowledge.

I've contributed to downtown open space planning initiatives, street design recommendations, and zoning changes throughout Seattle. In my roles facilitating project reviews and supervising a team of 20 planners, I have acquired extensive expertise in the Land Use Code (Title 23), the SEPA, ECA and Tree Ordinances (Title 25), and Seattle's Comprehensive Plan. The short tenure of this interim position presents a valuable opportunity to constructively add to the discussion and decision-making on housing affordability, transit and related land use development among other issues on the Council's agenda. I will energetically assist the district with keen engagement, fairness and compassion.
