- Mandate all new officers hired by SPD live within the Seattle city limits
- Close Pike Place, the street running through Pike Place Market, to non-market-vendor vehicle traffic
- Work with King County to repeal the bike helmet law
- Force developers to provide convenient pedestrian bypasses during construction
- Ban gas-powered leaf blowers within the city limits
- 6 Break ground on the Ballard Missing Link
- Remove beer garden barriers during Seattle
 Center events, allowing festival-goers to drink
 throughout the venue
- Make automobile turn signal usage the highest traffic enforcement policy for SPD officers
- 9 Establish the domestic short-hair cat as the official City Mammal
- Create a policy which opens the waterfront tunnel one Sunday morning a month to bikes and pedestrians only
- 11 Ban cars with tinted front windows
- Mandate that developers pay for repairs to street and sidewalk infrastructure within a three block radius upon completion of a project
- Ban single-occupancy motorized bikes from the Burke-Gilman Trail
- 14 Restrict overtime for Seattle police officers
- Tear down the Wallingford "goat fence" along NE 40th Street
- Establish parking spaces for car share vehicles at the University of Washington light rail station
- 17 Allow ORCA card usage on the monorail

- Deny Hempfest its application to use Myrtle Edwards Park during a summer weekend
- 19 Repaint all sharrows
- Ban "The Wave" from publicly funded sports arenas
- Rotate stop signs on the Burke-Gilman Trail 90 degrees so they face car traffic, not bicycle traffic
- Close Pine Street at Westlake Plaza to automobile traffic
- 23 Allow car share vehicles to use HOV lanes
- Establish citywide parking restrictions for all public streets.
- 25 Sell citywide Restricted Parking Zone placards
- 26 Support a privately funded sports arena in SoDo
- Retain a small portion of the Alaskan Way Viaduct for creation of an elevated park
- Open the I-5 express lanes one Sunday morning a month to bikes and pedestrians only
- 29 Ban Ride the Ducks from city streets

- Approve construction of a bike/pedestrian bridge over I-5 at NE 47th Street, connecting Wallingford to the U District
