Levy-Funded Key Strategies

- Partnership with Seattle Parks and Rec to provide extended day academic and enrichment classes for targeted students
- Targeted intervention instruction provided by City Year corps members, instructional assistants and tutors to fill gaps in understanding and improve math performance
- Collaboration with Seattle Parks and Rec to encourage on time, daily attendance through interventions and targeted initiatives
- After-school language-based homework support provided for Somali students by Somali Instructional Assistants
- Expanded learning opportunities through Middle School Saturday Success Academy
- Additional small group reading and math intervention instruction provided during the school day by certificated and classified instructional staff
- Case management for select students offers daily check-ins that encourage positive relationships, daily attendance and goal setting
- Schoolwide implementation of Social-Emotional Learning Curriculum as part of a comprehensive Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) system
- Implementation of Teaching and Learning Lab framework in both math and literacy provides staff with real time coaching and support to expand instructional knowledge and capacity
- Participating in Empower Mathematics Project (EMP) Professional Development project in collaboration with the City of Seattle's Department of Education and Early Learning, Seattle Public Schools and the University of Washington. EMP strives to improve teacher practice, support the integration of 21st Century Skills such as persistence and grit into classrooms, and engage families in the important role of middle school math in high school completion and college access
- South Shore operates on-site summer learning program to provide additional academic and enrichment opportunities
