THE BOYS IN THE BOAT AUTHOR HOPES MOVIE RIGHTS SHIFT FROM WEINSTEIN COMPANY

Author Daniel James Brown sold the movie rights to his nonfiction bestseller *The Boys in the Boat* to producer Harvey Weinstein seven years ago and now hopes Weinstein's upcoming bankruptcy court auction will lead to new ownership. Brown told a recent Seattle City Club audience he got "very anxious to remove the project from the Weinstein Company" after sexual misconduct allegations



beset the studio's co-founder. If another studio picks up the movie rights to *The Boys in the Boat*, a low-key campaign to convince the producers to film the movie in Washington state may resume.

STUDY STATES THOSE WHO ATTEND A CONCERT EVERY TWO WEEKS ADD NINE YEARS TO THEIR LIVES

A study conducted by O2 and behavioral science expert Patrick Fagan found that regular concert attendance can increase one's lifespan by up to nine years. According to the study, there's a "positive correlation between regularity of gig attendance and well-being," and "additional scholarly research directly links high levels of wellbeing with a lifespan increase of nine years."
