The Seattle Music Industry Survey is open through October 31. The survey results will help inform our work to support the local music industry. We're looking for well-rounded representation from people who have different roles within Seattle/King County music - not only musicians, but



also sound engineers, teachers, talent buyers, music retailers, agents, music therapists, nonprofits, DJs, venue owners and staff, instrument makers, promoters, and more. We also want to ensure diverse representation in terms of gender, race/ethnicity, and age. To take the survey, respondents simply must 1) live within King County and 2) do some work related to music (no matter how part-time or gig-based). At the end of the survey, they can enter to win a \$50 gift certificate to a local music business of their choice.

Seattle Music Commissioner SassyBlack - otherwise known as Catherine Harris-White - has been an influential part of Seattle's music scene for the past decade. Her latest EP, "Wakanda Funk Lounge," was released in June 2018. MICROSOFT CO-FOUNDER PAUL ALLEN DIES AT 65 LEAVING BEHIND A LASTING IMPACT ON SEATTLE CULTURE

Paul Allen, co-founder of Microsoft and an important leader in Seattle's cultural community, died Monday at the age of 65 from non-Hodgkin lymphoma. While Allen's contributions to science and technology have forever transformed



Seattle, his enormous influence on our cultural landscape was particularly felt by those working in music, film and the visual and performing arts. A tireless champion of art and music, Allen was a significant contributor to KEXP and played music himself throughout his life. He also rescued his childhood theater, the Seattle Cinerama, from demolition in 1998, founded the Museum of Pop Culture in 2000, and was a frequent lender and donor to the Seattle Art Museum.
