- Stacy helped compile numbers: 47 villagers 28 men 18 women & 1 non-binary. 26 pets 8 dogs and 17 cats 1 rabbit.
- 0 move outs 0 move ins and 0 exits for infractions
- 1 911 call for person outside of village.
- Big News King county came and administer vaccines to 13 villagers. Coffee and doughnuts for them. Moderna. Will be back in 4 weeks for second dose. A lot of villagers have already been getting vaccinations on their own. Others decided after to get it, so they are being directed to where to go.
- Clean ups are on the way, large roll up bin ordered that has been going around collecting trash.
 - o Each house will be given a formal letter and game plan.
- Madeline has been helping get the kitchen built up. Racks and Tables have been added. Working on replacing flooring in the kitchen. Grill has also been acquired.
- Upcoming Thursday Neighborhood House. First time they will be there they assist will educational opportunities and other assistance.
- Ongoing: Nurses every Tuesday. Built a great rapport with villagers.
- Operation Sac lunch still delivering M-F

Georgetown Village Development report

- Madeline- Hoping to redo electrical in kitchen area. Including appliances and lighting. Hopefully outdoor gathering area will be built soon.
- Gardening classes are being offered by Tilt

Georgetown Village Case Management report

- Just began and has touched bases with all clients.
- Hotel pacific rapid rehousing. Referrals went out for villagers.
- March 24th The Clay opened. Over seen by Lehi and referrals were sent out. Screenings are going on now.
- Working on getting SSN card for multiple clients.
- Directive regarding stimulus check. All clients were made aware of this assistance.
 - o Report to the supervisors about who received what checks.
- Helped file taxes in part of recovery.
 - o Filed 8822 for change of address reporting to IRS.
- Updating vulnerability assessments. Eligible for ABD. Some in line for second interview.
