





Contacts by Gender



Contacts by Race




Race by Gender



Trends:

- ❖ The team has made significantly more contacts with males than females.
- ❖ As reflected in other surveys and reports, People of color are more likely to be homeless.
- ❖ The team contacts African American males 3 times as much as they contact African American Females.
- ❖ We are seeing a 1:1 ratio between females and males living unsheltered within the Native American/First Nation.
 - ❖ Almost 1:1 ratio between white males and females


Services Offered



Trends in Services Offered:

- ❖ Shelter is the most frequently offered service by the team
 - ❖ Nav Center
 - ❖ Compass First Pres.
 - ❖ Peter's Place
 - ❖ Blaine Center
 - ❖ Hammond House
- ❖ Access to sanctioned encampments is the second most offered service
 - ❖ Georgetown
 - ❖ Camp Second Chance
 - ❖ Licton Springs


Referrals to Alternative Living Arrangements




Trends in Referrals to Alternative Living Arrangements:

- ❖ Referrals to low-barrier shelters are the most frequently used resource by the team
- ❖ Navigation Center was frequently accessed resource when first became available in summer of 2017, but has since been at-or-near capacity
- ❖ First Presbyterian figures are higher due to large capacity and exits to homelessness, which is a trend that has emerged with San Francisco's low-barrier model as well
- ❖ The Licton Springs sanctioned encampment has had the least amount of turnover


Count of Services Requested by American Indians




Count of Services Requested by African Americans




Count of Services Requested by Caucasian

Count of Services Requested by Asian







Trends in Service Requests:

- Vehicle repair was a service almost exclusively requested by Caucasians


SERVICES ACCEPTED BY RACE






