The Columbia City Landmark District Review Committee is advisory to the Landmarks Preservation Board. Any changes to the exterior of any building or structure in the District (including signage, painting and mechanical systems), or to the external appearance of any property or public right-ofway in the District as well as the construction of new structures or buildings must be reviewed and approved by <u>both</u> the Columbia City Review Committee and the Landmarks Preservation Board.

A complete application must be submitted to the Historic Preservation Program, Department of Neighborhoods. Please allow 28 days from the date you submit your application for the Historic **Preservation staff to determine if it is complete**. Once an application is determined to be complete, it will be placed on the agenda for the next available Review Committee and Board meetings. If you are considering doing any work on your building or property, please contact the Board Coordinator at 206-684-0226 for assistance in preparing your application.

The Columbia City Review Committee meetings are typically held on the <u>1</u>st **Tuesday of the month, at 4:00 p.m., at the Rainier Arts Center, 3515 S. Alaska St., Seattle, WA 98118.** The Landmarks Preservation Board meets the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month, at 3:30 p.m. in City Hall, 600 4th Ave. S., room L-2 (Boards and Commissions Room), Seattle, WA, unless otherwise noted below. All meetings of the Columbia City Review Committee and Landmarks Preservation Board are open to the public.
