Name and Address of Property:

Horiuchi Mural Seattle Center Thomas Street, south of Seattle Center House

Legal Description: D.T. Denny's Third Addition, Block 47

At the public meeting held on September 15, 2004, the City of Seattle's Landmarks Preservation Board voted to approve designation of the Horiuchi Mural as a Seattle Landmark based upon satisfaction of the following standards for designation of SMC 25.12.350:

A. It is the location of or is associated in a significant way with an historic event with a significant effect upon the community, city, state, or nation

B. It is associated in a significant way with the life of a person important in the history of the community, city, state or nation.

- C. It is associated in a significant way with a significant aspect of the cultural, political, or economic heritage of the community, city, state or nation.
- D. It embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of an architectural style, or period, or of a method of construction.
- E. It is an outstanding work of a designer or builder
- F. Because of its prominence of spatial location, contrasts of siting, age, or scale, it is an easily identifiable visual feature of its neighborhood or the city and contributes to the distinctive quality or identity of such neighborhood or city.
