INTERIM DECISION MAKING

In the absence of an adopted decision-making process, coming in the by-laws, we will use the following process until we have adopted Rules & Procedures:

- 1. A Co-Chair will request a motion.
- 2. A Commissioner makes a motion.
- 3. Another Commissioner seconds the motion.
- 4. A Co-Chair will restate the motion.
- 5. Commissioners consider/discuss the motion.
- 6. A Co-Chair will put the motion up for a vote by a show of hands.
- 7. A Co-Chair will announce the result of the vote.
