


# 2016 MIMP Annual Report: TMP Highlights

- 2016 was the first year the campus surveyed on the same cycle.
- Campus experienced employment growth while still making (marginal) progress towards the TMP goal.
- Installed new garage equipment that is able to support smarter technology for the purpose of commute behavior change.
- Launched the Caregiver Commute program powered by Luum and added additional staff.
- Leveraged recent investments to expand programs and services (flexible daily parking & enhanced ridematching) and boost participation in existing TMP programming.
- Active participation in the Integrated Transportation Board (ITB), which is a multistakeholder group charged with building consensus and a unified approach to addressing the challenges of vehicular congestion and parking around the campus.


# Curbing Neighborhood Parking



#### 2016 MODE SPLIT DATA-CHERRY HILL




#### 2016 MODE SPLIT DATA - ORGANIZATION




#### 2016 PERCENTAGE OF COMMUTE TRIPS TO CAMPUS
