MIMP

December 2005 City Council Approved MIMP for Swedish First Hill

MIMP sets Code Standards for Block 95 Project

Four categories of MIMP Requirements:

- Design Standards (i.e., zoning code)
- Design Guidelines
- City Council Conditions
- MIMP EIS Conditions (i.e., SEPA mitigation requirements)

Standing Advisory Committee Action

- Matrix comprehensively details how MIMP requirements are met
- September 17, 2015, SAC voted to affirm that project designs meet MIMP requirements

Wayfinding Plan required by MIMP City Council Condition No. 3

- June 6, 2007, DPD approved Wayfinding Plan for Swedish First Hill
- Wayfinding Plan includes Implementation Schedule for improvements
- Matrix comprehensively details how Wayfinding improvements tied to Block 95 are achieved

Public Benefits must exceed MIMP Requirements and any SEPA Mitigation

- Matrix comprehensively details how public benefits go beyond related MIMP requirements
- Only additional SEPA mitigation expected from MUP process are transportation improvements for vehicle flow (Current vehicular flow features of project are tied to existing MIMP requirements, not proposed public benefits)
- Matrix comprehensively details how public benefits go beyond 2005 MIMP EIS Mitigation

- 1. Show how the proposed public benefits implement the First Hill Public Realm Action Plan (PRAP).
- 2. Develop and present a larger strategy for the proposed benefits related to all petitions.
- 3. Present the streetscape and open space designs in their architectural context.
- 4. Look beyond the boundaries of the campus for public benefit opportunities that can be implemented.
- 5. Explain how ambulances and trucks will maneuver and circulate
- 6. Further define the function and role of rain gardens
- 7. Confirm EIS addendum and MIMP requirements are separate from proposed public benefits.
- 8. Consult with the Swedish MIMP SAC and the Frye Museum
- 9. Optimize and provide information on the solar exposure of proposed open spaces
- 10. Demonstrate how the Boren facade creates visual interest without causing driver distraction and provides a public asset.
- 11. Explain how and the extent to which you will implement the Boylston Streetscape Plan.
- 12. Address walkability and equity as it relates to the proposed development and public benefits.
- 13. Design the public benefit spaces to be welcoming and inclusive.
- 14. Proposed crosswalks, including those crossing Boren and James, must be approved by SDOT.
- 15. Continue to explore limiting loading times of the very large trucks.



- 3. Work with SDOT to complete a concept plan for the Swedish Mile to guide future developments




FIRST HILL PUBLIC REALM ACTION PLAN (PRAP)

VISION

Connecting parks and public space to enhance mobility and livability in First Hill.

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGIES

- A new approach has been taken to consider street right-of-way as a means to achieve not only connectivity, but also park space that serves the working and residential populations of First Hill.
- The Public Realm Action Plan includes the development of near term implementation strategies to expand the public space network through right of way reallocation, private development partnership and strategic site selection for potential acquisition.




FIRST HILL PUBLIC REALM ACTION PLAN (PRAP)

Park and Open Space Criteria What is an Active Zone?

Park Active Zones are areas in the Public Right of Way that provide areas for exercise and outdoor activity. These can range from elements with prescribed uses to more flexible, open ended use design options.



Potential Active Zone Loop: 1.7 miles



PROCESS

- Build on established and well-recognized Swedish Art Program through engaging local artists to implement exterior publicly accessible artwork.
- 4Culture is engaged to manage selection process for the project Public Art Program Manager. Selection complete by January 2016.
- Public Art Program Manager will lead a committee of volunteers to select artists for defined projects.
 Focus on local artists from the Pacific Northwest. Artists will be engaged with design team in Spring 2016.
- Artists will present proposals to Swedish committee and members of the PAAC for review and approval.




