

#### **The Purpose**

**The Five-Year Capital Budget is intended to** put the Long-Term **Capital Plan (15 year** look ahead) into operation by identifying specific investments that will lead to its long-term objectives.



## **Aligning - Demand to Funding**

- Demand categories:
  - Clinical
  - Growth
  - Renewal
  - Strategic
- Primary funding sources:
  - State
  - Debt
  - Gift
  - Equity

#### **Four Main Strategies**

- 1. Seek to make capital investments in existing buildings approximately equal to the facilities deterioration rate.
- 2. Increase UW Medicine's access to debt.
- 3. Seek to reduce the total square footage growth rate to approximately 0.5% per year assuming relatively flat growth in our student body population, in order to lower the annual SF growth rate we've experienced over the last decade.
- 4. Leverage partnerships.

#### **Capital Budgeting Process**

- Identification of potential projects
  - Visions of colleges/schools/units
- Testing & refinement
  - Scoring/ranking, overall financial capacities
- Approval of the Capital Budget
  - Regent approval in combination with operating budget
- Approval of individual projects
  - \$5-15M under delegated authority
  - \$15M and over approved by Regents



### **Project Types**

- Active Capital
  - Projects that have been approved by the Regents and are underway
- Core Capital
  - Projects that are typically funded by the UW Building Account (Student fees)
- Institutional Capital
  - Projects that score well, but need additional formation prior to approval by the Regents
- Clinical Capital
  - Projects related to the UW Medicine Clinical Enterprise
