Encourage your employees/members to join in a neighborhood service project:

- Clean up a nearby park: visit Seattle Parks and Recreation volunteer page or email ParksVolunteer@Seattle.Gov.
- Paint a fence, rake leaves, or other yard cleanup especially for elderly or disabled neighbors.
- Plant trees or some native plants.
- Organize a neighborhood clean-up.

Organize a special event or offer:

- Host an open house at your business location where neighbors can mingle and network.
- Create a special Neighbor Day discount valid on the day/week of May 4.
- Host a neighborhood food or clothing drive.
- Offer up your venue for a neighborhood game event or group art project.
- Donate a portion of your sales that day to a local non-profit organization or neighborhood project.
- Facilitate a neighborhood business tour where residents can learn more about local businesses and get to know business owners and employees.
- Host an open-mic in which neighbors can share stories, music, and poetry.
- Hold a bake sale for charity or to raise money for a neighborhood project.

Spread the word by encouraging random acts of kindness:

- Make sure your employees, customers, and members know about Neighbor Day and how they can participate.
- Ask us for materials to help with promotion (ie. posters, cards, web graphics, etc.)
- Share stories of your customers, neighbors, and Neighbor Day activities on social media using #neighborday.
