- Plant a tree or some native plants.
- Clean up a sidewalk for an easier walking path.
- Have a neighborhood clean-up.


Organize a neighborhood event:

- Organize a [Block Watch](#), a program of Seattle Police Department.
- Hold a neighborhood food or clothing drive.
- Have a neighborhood BBQ, potluck, pancake breakfast, or spaghetti feed.
- Organize a [SNAP \(Seattle Neighborhoods Actively Prepared\)](#) group.
- Organize a game or sporting event.
- Have a block party.
- Invite neighbors over for dessert.
- Organize a neighborhood rummage or garage sale.
- Have a neighborhood treasure hunt.
- Have a book, plant, or cookie exchange.
- Have a progressive event: a dinner or neighbor work party.

Other ideas:

- Go for a [bike ride](#) with your neighbor and check out the local scenery.
- Stop by your local [Fire station](#) and meet the crew.
- Find other neighbors who play instruments and play music.
- Invite your neighbor to go for a hike.
- Hold a "[Stencil a Storm Drain](#)" party.
