Middle School	Key Partners: Seattle Parks Dept.; Roxhill, Concord, West Seattle, and Highland Park Elementary Schools; Seattle Youth Violence Prevention Initiative; Seattle Youth Employment Program; Neighborhood House; Seattle Police Dept.; and, Sound Mental Health	Levy Summer Learning funds are supporting expansion of last year’s Westside Scholars pilot – which uses Levy Innovation funds to support rising 7 th and 8 th graders – to add support for incoming sixth-graders from Denny’s four feeder Elementary Schools with the highest percentage of poverty. The program is focusing on accelerated reading and math achievement and on helping students navigate the transition to middle school.	80	\$73,363

YMCA	Site: Cleveland HS Key Partners: Aki Kurose, Hamilton, Madison, and Washington middle schools	YMCA’s University Leadership, Education, Adventure, Responsibility, NOW! (Y.U. LEARN) program is serving rising 7 th and 8 th graders from Aki Kurose, Hamilton, Madison and Washington middle schools. The program will focus instruction on math, language arts, and project-based learning in science.	57	\$55,449

Refugee Women's Alliance (ReWA)	Site: Seattle World School Key Partner: Vietnamese Friendship Association	The program serves low- and very-low income refugee and immigrant rising 9th to 12th graders who will be enrolled at SWS in fall 2013. The "Summer Science Academy" is designed to help refugee and immigrant students improve their English language skills by exploring a different type of habitat each week. Language arts credit retrieval classes are being offered as well.	140	\$49,981
Seattle Public Schools	Sites: Chief Sealth, Cleveland, and Roosevelt high schools (open sites) Key Partner: College Access Now	Seattle Public Schools is offering credit retrieval programs to students behind in language arts and math credits needed for graduation. In partnership with College Access Now (CAN), the program is delivering college and career readiness enrichment lessons to help students navigate career and post-secondary education options after high school.	200	\$259,026
Southwest Youth & Family Services	Site: Southwest Education Center at SW Youth & Families Services Key Partner: Interagency Academy	The Summer Young Writers Workshop serves students who are at significant risk of school failure; deficient in credits required to graduate in four years; or who would benefit from emotional and behavioral support to make progress toward graduation. In addition to improving vocabulary, grammar and written composition skills, students will have the opportunity to deepen their experience with public speaking and learn word processing and website building skills through production of a blog about their projects.	17	\$39,188
YMCA	Sites: Chief Sealth (combined with West Seattle), Cleveland, and Franklin high schools	YMCA's Level 9 (CSHS/WSHS & FHS) and Project 206 (CHS) programs provide a bridge between 8 th and 9 th grade by helping students transfer what they have learned in middle school to the content and rigor of high school. Academic classes are combined with active hands-on service learning projects and High School 101 sessions to help students prepare for success in 9 th grade. Project 206 participants will also benefit from Cleveland's STEM resources, which will be incorporated into science classes devoted to project-based learning.	140	\$122,264
