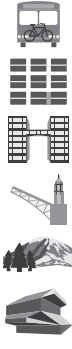

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Adopted a policy for equity in the design of public spaces and facilities that emphasizes inclusive public outreach strategies for historically marginalized populations.
- As the Light Rail Review Panel, completed its final review of Sound Transit's design and planning of light rail projects for the Central, University, North, and East Link Extensions.
- Selected four projects reviewed by the SDC for the 2016 Design Excellence Awards: Fire Station 20, Bicycle Master Plan, UW Light Rail Station, and Mapes Creek Restoration.
- Drafted a report of urban design recommendations for the SR 520 project between Lake Washington and I-5, in particular the land bridge and Montlake Lid.
- Reviewed several CIP projects relating to the Seattle Opera expansion, including parks, transportation infrastructure, and public facilities.
