Project Presentation

The Woodland Park Zoo presented concepts for its new naturalistic home for tigers and Asian bears, remodeling a 60-year-old exhibit space. The exhibit will feature an immersion experience for the visitor, an architectural and horticultural style defined by place, better animal and staff welfare, better efficiency for servicing and maintaining the exhibit, and lower energy and water use.

SUMMARY (by Osama)

The Design Commission thanked the Woodland Park Zoo and its design team for its presentation of the Tiger Asian Bear Exhibit. The commission appreciated the long sections, which are important to understand this project. The commission approved the concept design by a vote of 7-0 and offered the following comments:

- Return for a review by the commission before design development.
- Make the exhibit as accessible as possible for all visitors. Think about accessibility broadly, beyond the ADA definition of accessibility for site planning.
- Push the project's sustainability. Reusing the buildings is a commendable start, but explore additional sustainability strategies. Explain the plans for earthwork and demolition.
- Show the back of house to demonstrate to visitors how the zoo has created buildings for the animals.

The commission asked that the team improve its presentation and materials for the next review, including: provide more background on the zoo masterplan; create diagrams that delineate the public areas and the back of house; and prepare 11x17 handouts of key graphics.
