

Washington Park Stormwater Tank Maintenance Project

Project Overview

Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) owns and operates a stormwater storage tank in Washington Park south of the Washington Park Playfield.

In 2021, SPU contractor crews will perform a maintenance upgrade project to improve the way this facility manages flows during rain events.

SPU is performing this maintenance work to improve SPU's ability to monitor and control stormwater flows and allow us to use our existing infrastructure more efficiently while improving regional water quality.

Location

Work will take place south of the Washington Park Playfield in Washington Park near E Roy St, 29th Ave E, and E Madison St.

Schedule

Work will begin in mid-May of 2021, and it is expected to take about 6-7 months to complete.

Anticipated Impacts

Most of the work for this maintenance upgrade project will occur in the belowground storage tank, however, you can expect:

- Work to typically occur during weekday, daytime hours
- Construction traffic, noise, dirt, and dust
- Restricted public access to the section of Washington Park that is south of the Washington Park Playfield throughout construction. Please use an alternative route to access the park and playfield
- The pedestrian path that connects from the playfield to the entrances at E Madison St and the intersection of E Roy St and 29th Ave E will be closed
- Following construction, SPU will perform landscaping and vegetation restoration in the park
