

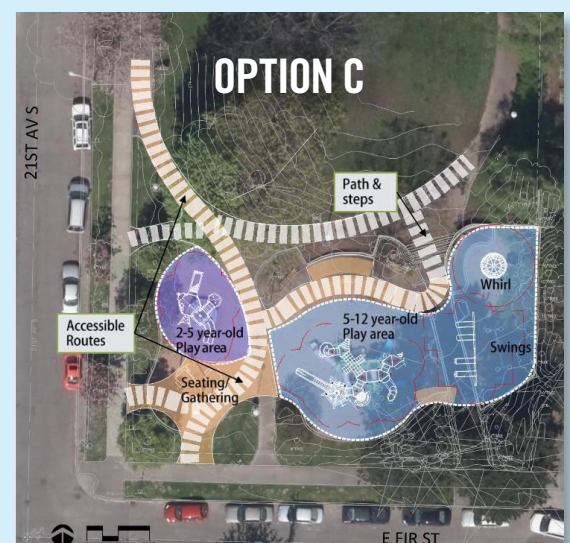
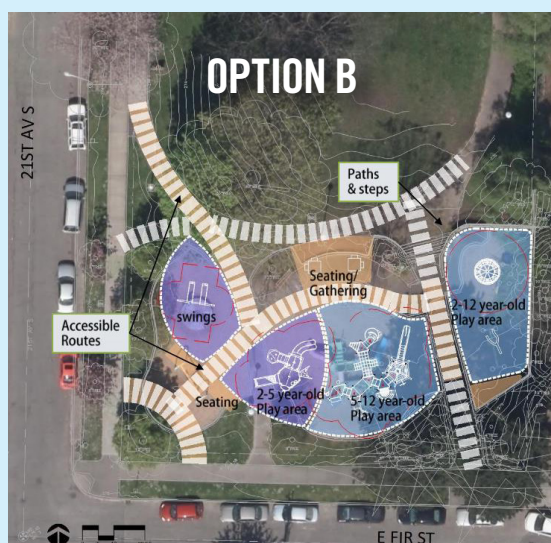
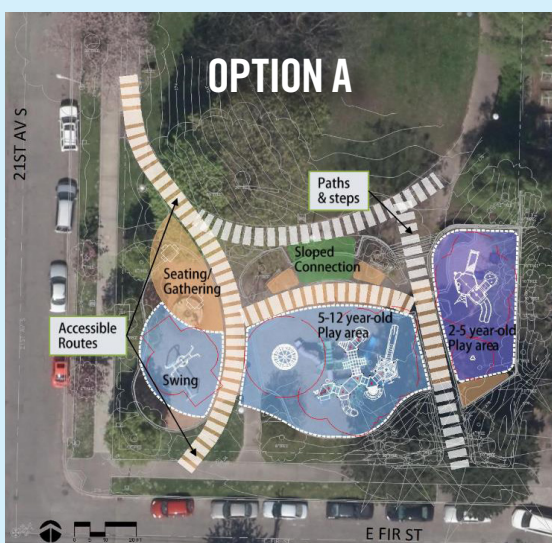

SPRUCE STREET MINI PARK PLAY AREA RENOVATION

We wanted to thank you in advance for contributing your thoughts on what is most important to you as we move forward with this project. 70 community members gave us early input through an online survey to help jumpstart the design process for the play area renovation. When asked to rank what features would improve your enjoyment of the play area and the park, we heard the community's top priorities are including play features for kids of all ages, more benches/picnic tables to sit or or gather at, incorporation of art, and better lighting for safety. When we asked what is the community character or identity that is best reflected in the park, many expressed a strong support in honoring the African American community and the local culture and history of the Central District neighborhood.


The design team incorporated the community's early input into play area play area concept designs.
