I. DESIGN BACKGROUND

A. DETAILED PROJECT SCOPE

This project will develop the open space acquired by Seattle Parks and Recreation (SPR) in 2013 immediately adjacent to the existing Baker Park. The design will incorporate accessibility in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) as well as SPR's intent to create access to open space in areas of high urban density. Impervious surfacing shall be limited to 15% or less, excluding trail and circulation surfaces.
