

**SEPA DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE (DNS)
SEATTLE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (SDOT)
PEDESTRIAN MASTER PLAN**

Description of proposal: The non-project action will adopt, by resolution, the City of Seattle Pedestrian Master Plan (PMP), an update from 2009 that ensures it continues to reflect best practices in policy, planning, and design. The plan includes a vision, goals, and objectives that guide implementation of the PMP. A Priority Investment Network (PIN) was developed within walksheds along arterials and non-arterials that serve as important walking routes to K-12 public schools, transit stops on the Frequent Transit Network, and connect people to and within urban centers and urban villages. The PMP provides implementation strategies and actions for the PIN organized into five groups: Along-the-Roadway; Crossing-the-Roadway; Network-wide; Education, Encouragement and Enforcement; and Pedestrian Realm Quality and Comfort. Performance measures will help track the PMP's effectiveness over time and measure the progress toward achieving the goals of safety, equity, vibrancy, and health.

Location of proposal including street address, if any: The Pedestrian Master Plan applies to the entire City of Seattle.


Lead Agency: SDOT

Box 94729, Seattle, WA 98124; telephone: (206) 684-0521. **The appeal must be filed no later than 5:00 PM March 14, 2017.** The appellant should be prepared to make specific factual objections.
