PURPOSE

A regular quarterly update to the Levy to Move Seattle Oversight Committee detailing SDOT spending on Move Seattle projects to help facilitate the role of the committee to monitor revenues, expenditures, and program and project implementation.

SUMMARY

In Q1 2018, SDOT spent \$23M on Move Seattle projects.

The Q1 2018 spending report includes approximately \$8.5M in Safe Routes, \$5.9M in Maintenance & Repair, and \$8.3M in Congestion Relief. Levy sub-programs that recorded the most spending in 2018-Q1 included:

Safe Routes \$8.5M

o Bike Master Plan Implementation: \$3.4M

o Transportation Operations \$1.8M

o ADA / Curb Ramps: \$1M

Maintenance & Repair \$5.9M

o Arterial Roadway Maintenance (AAC Paving Program): \$2.2M

o Bridge and Structure Maintenance: \$1.2M

Congestion Relief \$8.3M

o Multimodal Improvements: \$2.4M

o Pedestrian Master Plan Implementation: \$1.8M

o Traffic Signal Timing Improvements \$1.3M

The \$23M SDOT spent on Move Seattle project in Q1 2018 represents 7% of the tentative Revised Budget (\$331M) once carry-forward funds from 2017 are added to the budget.

Q1 2018 HIGHLIGHTS

Fairview Ave N Bridge Replacement Project

Project overview

We are replacing the bridge at Fairview Ave N. The oldest portion of the current bridge was built more than 65 years ago and is the last timber-supported bridge on a major road in Seattle. While safe for travel today, the bridge is structurally unstable and vulnerable to earthquakes, including the newer portion made of steel and concrete, and needs to be replaced. Located on the southeast shore of Lake Union near the 1200 block of Fairview Ave N in Seattle, the bridge is next to the historic Lake Union Steam Plant building.



Update

We have been busy navigating the complex permitting process in Q1 2018 to advance this project into the construction phase. Permits secured include:

- January: NOAA/NMFS Biological Opinion issued
- February: Revised HPA issued
- March: Ecology 401 permit revision approved
- March: Section 106 process completed
- March: Shoreline Permit revision approved
- March: NEPA technical reviews & discipline reports completed
- March: NPDES permit

Construction is now anticipated to start in late 2018.

2nd Ave Mobility Improvements

Project Overview

To improve the safety and efficiency of travel and bike connections downtown, the 2nd Ave Mobility Improvements project added three new traffic signals (at Cedar St, Clay St, and Vine St), pedestrian improvements, and extended the existing 2nd Ave protected bike lane through Belltown from Pike St to Denny Way. This project is part of the Seattle Vision Zero Plan to end traffic deaths and serious injuries by 2030.



Update

The 2nd Ave protected bike lane opened to riders in February 2018.

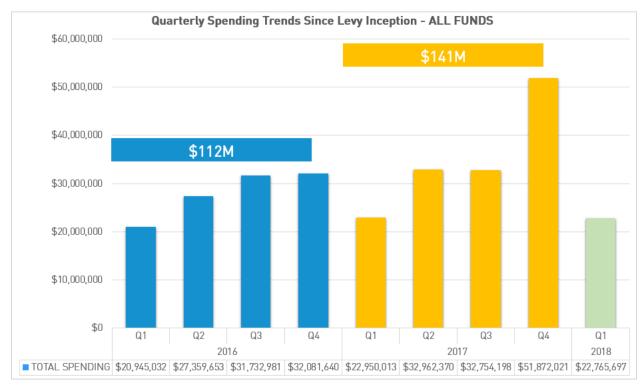

Q1 2018 BUDGET UPDATE

Consistent with previous years, Q1 2018 spending reports show a decrease in the total amount spent compared to Q4 in the year prior due to the seasonality of SDOT work. The Q1 2018 spending of \$23M is similar to Q1 spending in 2016 (\$20.9M) and Q1 spending in 2017 (\$23M).



An additional \$160M in carry-forward funds will be added to the Adopted Budget of \$171M. See Appendix B for more detailed information. SDOT Finance staff and the Office of Move Seattle are currently working on budget re-appropriations for 2018 and will have an update for the Levy Oversight Committee at the next quarterly update meeting.

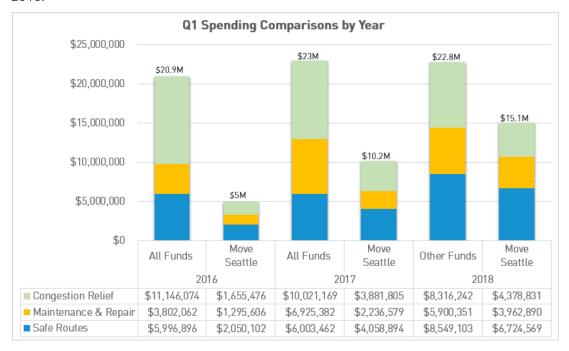
