Apply to join the Move Seattle Levy Oversight Committee

Are you passionate about Seattle transportation? The Move Seattle Levy Oversight Committee seeks candidates to apply for service on the Committee that monitors revenues, program and project progress on the \$930 million [Levy to Move Seattle](#). We're currently accepting applications for a new member of the Move Seattle [Levy Oversight Committee](#) to fill one position. This position will fill a vacancy and serve a partial term through the end of 2019. Appointed members will be considered for reappointment at the end of the initial term to serve a full, four-year term.

The Levy Oversight Committee is interested in applicants with background or experience in transportation, management, bridge and structures engineering, public policy, finance, advocacy, social services, and business. Members must be Seattle residents. Oversight Committee members appointments are subject to confirmation by Seattle City Council.

The Move Seattle Levy Oversight Committee is as a vital mechanism of accountability on how Move Seattle Levy revenues are spent. The Committee advises the City Council, the Mayor, and the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) on responding to program and project cost savings or overruns.

Board members represent a variety of ages, levels of mobility, diverse communities, and reside in neighborhoods throughout the city. Board members meet on the first Tuesday of each month from 5:30-7:30 PM in downtown Seattle. Board members shall serve voluntarily without compensation. On a case-by-case basis, we will offer bus tickets for board members to get to board meetings and reimbursement for child care while attending meetings.

The City of Seattle is committed to promoting diversity in our boards and commissions. People of color, low-income communities, immigrant and refugee populations, people living with disabilities, people experiencing homelessness, LGBTQ people, women and girls, youth, seniors and Native Populations are encouraged to apply.
