


# MONTHLY STATUS REPORT – JANUARY 2020

## Seattle Free-Floating Bike Share Program


### Summary

- Ridership in January 2020 fell below that in December 2019 and January 2019 totals.
- Lime shut down bike share operations in December 2019, leaving Jump as the only bike share provider in Seattle and a total fleet less than half of January 2019.
- January 2020 was one of the rainiest Januarys in Seattle’s history, potentially contributing to fewer total rides.



### Total trips

In January 2020, bike share users took about **64,000** trips<sup>11</sup> on a fleet of about 2,200-3,200 bikes.
